

Administration


Public Works is currently working on an Asset Management presentation for Council at the beginning of 2025 and a Transportation Master Plan to be presented to Council in early 2025.

Water & Sewer


The graphs below illustrate the water consumption in the Hamlets on the ACE water distribution line per the water volume billed from ACE.




Included in the monthly consumption for Dewberry is the water sold at the bulk water station. For the month of January it was 16.8 m3.

- Tender for contracted gravel haul and stockpiling, as outlined below, was posted and closed in December with decision for award in January 2025.

- Unwin Pit to Haan Stockpile 14,000 yd3
- o Bykowski 3 Pit to Kochan Stockpile 30,000 yd3
- In house staff will continue to stockpile gravel from the Bykowski 3 Pit to Kochan Stockpile throughout the winter when resources are not required for winter road maintenance.

Road Maintenance

Road Maintenance activities of note:

- Weekend On Call schedule started last week in October for the winter season.
- Operators have been provided lists of the assigned driveways under the snow plow flag program for residents that have purchased a flag.
- Winter sand and salt inventory levels are being monitored with additional amounts being trucked in as necessary.
- Working on communications strategy for notifying public of the brushing partnership program for 2025.
- 83 road maintenance concerns were received in December via the concern tracker. There have been 83 road maintenance concerns received this year to date.
