Council Meeting Highlights

- Council approved the issuance of a credit card through ATB Financial the Marwayne
 Fire & Rescue Volunteers to ease the financial burden of fueling the fire trucks after hours.
- Council approved our participation in Lemonade Day at a cost of \$500.00 this coming
 June. More details to come—keep an eye out on our social media!
- Council approved the Asset Retirement Obligations Policy FN 25.
- Eileen Hines was re-appointed to the Marwayne Public Library board for a 3 year term.
- The Village entered into a Joint Election Agreement with Buffalo Trail Public Schools for their board trustee in the upcoming 2025 General Municipal Election.
- The Border Paws Animal Shelter Fee Structure Amendment has been received as information. Border Paws will now be charging \$1000.00 per dog and \$500.00 per cat for every intake, subject to space availability. Additionally, all surrendered animals will be placed under a mandatory two-week quarantine period before they can be released. The Village strongly encourages pet owners to obtain a lifetime pet license to facilitate the swift reunification of lost animals with their owners.
- Council passed Animal Control Bylaw Amendment No. 604-25. This amendment reflects
 the new fee structure and quarantine period.



A Pastor's Gleanings

As we enter March this year, we find ourselves in uncertain times. War continues in Ukraine with devastating loss of life and infrastructure. In Canada we face a looming trade war with America, threatening our economic well being. There are estimates that 500,000 jobs are at risk just in the Province of Ontario alone. The consequences here in Alberta are unknown, bringing shadows of uncertainty over our future.

March also brings an expectation of longer, warmer days as the spring equinox approaches. We long for spring and I think most of us long for certainty. The sun is higher in the sky dispelling the long cold darkness of winter. Of this we can be certain.

As we look forward to spring think about this. When walking towards the sun, our shadow falls behind us. Otherwise, when we walk away from the sun, we are walking in our shadow.

John the Apostle wrote this about Jesus. "In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in darkness and the darkness has not overcome it." DISENFRANCHISED GRIEF

Disenfranchised grief refers to grief that is not openly acknowledged, socially supported, or publicly mourned. This type of grief is often felt by individuals whose loss is not recognized as significant by others, or who do not have the space to grieve openly. This may occur because the relationship with the deceased is not seen as socially acceptable or because the grief is hidden.

One example of disenfranchised grief includes the death of an ex-spouse or partner. Though a relationship ended, there is often an emotional bond that persists. When people lose an ex-partner, others may not understand the dynamics of this emotional bond and may not take their grief as valid. Pet loss is another example of disenfranchised grief. Many do not understand or accept the role that pets play in people's lives, and therefore, the loss of pets does not seem as significant as losing a human loved one. Miscarriage or stillbirth can also lead to experiencing disenfranchised grief and these losses are often considered hidden grieving experiences. Further, those who lose a loved one to suicide may also be navigating disenfranchised grief. The grief experienced by loved ones of someone who has taken their own life can be compounded by feelings of shame or stigma, leading to less support and understanding. These are just a few of the many experiences of disenfranchised grief.

The following symptoms of disenfranchised grief may be experienced:

- 1. Feelings of Isolation: Individuals experiencing disenfranchised grief often feel alone in their grief, lacking the typical support expected during times of grief.
- 2. Shame or Guilt: Individuals may question whether it is legitimate grief or wondering if they have the "right" to grieve.
- 3. Suppressed or Delayed Grief: In some cases, individuals may try to push their grief aside because it isn't recognized by others, which can lead to unprocessed emotions that can be delayed.
- 4. Confusion or Ambivalence: Individuals may feel uncertain about how to express their grief or whether it is acceptable to feel sad or devastated.
- 5. Anger or Frustration: Anger can arise from feeling that the loss is not acknowledged, or from a sense that the grief is being minimized by others.

Difficulty Finding Closure: Since others may not acknowledge the grief, it becomes difficult for individuals to find closure or healing.

Accessing support from grief counsellors or therapists and/or connecting with grief support groups can be helpful for navigating the symptoms experienced with disenfranchised grief.

Funds from this year's event will contribute to:


Replacing the arena ice surface and brine lines




