- ❑ Won Highway 16 Track and Field banner two out of the last three years – junior high



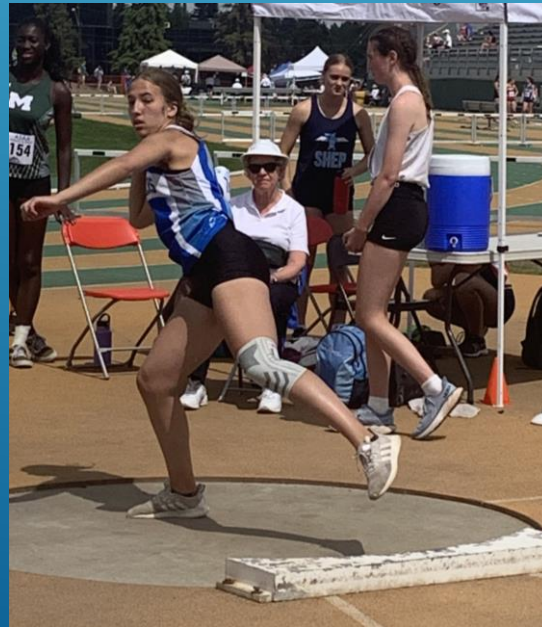
SUCCESS TO DATE:
